Information on the Type F Schuko plug Electrical Adapter Plug and Electrical Outlet

The Type F plug and outlet is much like the Type E, except it has two earth clips on the side rather than a female earth contact. It is commonly known as a "Schuko" plug, from the invented German word "Schukostecker" which means "protective contact plug."

The "Schuko" plug and receptacle with side grounding contacts has a connection system which is symmetrical, allowing the live and neutral to be reversed. Type F receptacles will also accept Type C and Type E plugs.

Electrical Voltage

Most electrical power systems are prone to slight variations in electrical voltage. The type F electrical plug is found in the countries listed here. Type F Electric Frequency

The type F electric frequency is shown in the number of hertz, or cycles per second. Even if voltages are similar, a 60 Hz device may not function properly on a 50 Hz current, so check if the type F wall plug is compatible with your electronics. Otherwise, you may need to find a type F plug adaptor that can lower the internal current. Type F adapters cannot, however, change the number of cycles. Visit us to get business phone numbers now. Type F Receptacle

The type F receptacle may also be called the type F electrical socket. If you have a plug that is incompatible with the type F electric socket, you may need to find a type F electrical transformer. Sometimes, however, transformers are not a practical solution for the traveler. They are often bulky, and it may be easier to buy or rent the device you need in the country you are visiting.
